

Principal's Corner

Welcome back, I hope everyone had a restful and peaceful Christmas break and a happy start to the new year. January is a very busy month for us. First, I want to inform parents of students in Grade 7 and 10 that you will be receiving an email from the school with information about the Alberta Education Assurance Survey that you will be asked to participate in. Parents and guardians will then receive in the mail from Canada Post a survey access code and survey information from Alberta Education. Students and staff at the school will also complete this survey. The survey provides the government information to assess what is working well and where there is room for improvement at the school and school division level. The survey asks students in grades 4, 7 and 10, and their parents, about their thoughts, feelings and experiences in school. The survey will be administered between January and March 2024.

As I have stated in previous newsletters, junior high students do not have an exam week in January. While some teachers are having midterm exams, these are being conducted during regular class time. For students who are entering the Registered Apprenticeship Program, you too qualify for scholarships as we have had many students earn the Registered Apprenticeship Scholarships. newsletter. Preparing for final exams can be a stressful experience and can create a lot of anxiety. Here are some **Quick study tips**:

- \Rightarrow Have a place to study. Avoid studying in your bed, have a desk or table where you can study
- \Rightarrow Take frequent breaks. Work for 15 minutes take a 5 minute break
- ⇒ Have all materials you might need to study -make a basket with necessary study items (pens, pencils, markers, highlighters, post it notes, cue cards, etc)
- \Rightarrow Study a little every night to prepare for your upcoming exams
- \Rightarrow Attend review sessions or complete review booklets
- \Rightarrow Get plenty of rest
- \Rightarrow Stay hydrated and eat nutritional foods
- \Rightarrow Put away all electronic devices that may be a distraction

VIBE has introduced each of you to a number of strategies to **reduce test anxiety**. For the day of your exam here are some helpful techniques:

- ⇒ Stay hydrated -- have a bottle of water with you
- \Rightarrow Get plenty of rest the night before the exam
- \Rightarrow Practice mindfulness activities
- $\Rightarrow\,$ Do some chair yoga while you are waiting for the exam to begin
- \Rightarrow Practice deep breathing prior to the exam -helps relax your muscles so you can relax
- \Rightarrow Visualize a positive result
- \Rightarrow Positive Self-Talk
- \Rightarrow Do all the questions you know first and come back to the harder questions
