Principal's Corner Continued

Some information on Diploma and PAT Exams: Alberta Education has announced that Diploma exams are expected to be administered for the rest of the school vear (April, June and August 2022). Students who were intending to rewrite a diploma exam in January 2022 and are not taking the course can register to rewrite in April 2022. Students who received an exemption and retake instruction in a diploma exam course must write the diploma exam to acquire a final official mark associated with the new school-awarded mark. Exemptions are not carried forward. Due to learning disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the weighting of diploma exams will be temporarily reduced to 10% for the 2021/22 school year only. This change is only temporary to address the learning disruptions that some students have experienced due to COVID-19. As for PAT exams, Alberta Education still maintains that it is mandatory for schools to administer all Grade 9 PAT subjects in June. These exam dates will be reflected in our school exam schedule that will be out shortly.

Easter break will occur starting April 15 and run through to April 22. That gives us approximately 2 months of instruction after we get back to close out the 2021-22 school year.

With spring also comes our school flower fundraiser. The flyer is included with this newsletter. It is our one big fundraiser of

the year for our Pirate Crews.

For Grade 12 students, Student Loan applications are found online starting in early May. Use this link to access the website: https://studentaid.alberta.ca/. The Alexander Rutherford applications are also available on this website. In order to receive funding you must apply at least one month prior to your attendance at a post-secondary institution. If you take a year or two off before attending post-secondary school, as long as you qualify, the funds are available to you, so make sure you apply. For information on how to apply, use this website: http://studentaid.alberta.ca/. Students who have created an Apply Alberta login are encouraged to use your PRI-VATE email address as your school address will disappear after June 30. The same login, password and email will be used to apply for your Rutherford Scholarship and Student Loan site so use one that is familiar to you, hopefully you will remember the password.


For students enrolled in Work Experience, RAP or Green Certificate, please continue to submit your hours, any midterm and final evaluations you may have to complete.

Mr. Zorniak is also the president of the Vegreville Cultural Association Vegreville Pysanka Festival and they have a 50/50





Varsity Boys came in 2nd, winning silver, in Zones in Cold Lake on March 11-12th (below).




Ski Trip & Ice Fishing

Rotary Youth Leadership Experience 2022 (RYLE)

Who is eligible? High school students grades 9-12 When is it? Friday April 28 to Sunday May 1, 2022 Where is it? Camp Nakamun (NW of Edmonton)

RYLE (Rotary Youth Leadership Experience) is an annual conference hosted by the RYLE Committee and sponsored by the Rotary Clubs of District 5370 (including northern Alberta and BC, western Saskatchewan, and the NWT). This experience is intended for high school students (grades 9 to 12) who would like to gain or strengthen their leadership skills and learn how to be active citizens who strive to make a positive impact in the world. RYLE will be held this year from Friday, April 28 to Sunday, May 1, 2022 at Camp Nakamun. Transportation to and from the camp will be provided. RYLE focuses on developing and promoting student leadership. We focus on foundations of communication, goal-setting, motivation, as well as introducing you to the facets of Rotary International. During RYLE, we will explore concepts such as interpersonal growth, communication, teamwork, community-building, and global citizenship. Experiential learning opportunities over the course of the 4-day experience emphasize building competency, confidence, and connections. You can expect to work cooperatively through hands-on workshops and challenges that will exercise your newly-acquired skills. Above all, you can expect to form tight networks with like-minded youth who also aspire to be strong and influential leaders.
