For Grade 12 Students who may want extra help preparing for Diploma Exams, **Diplomax** may be an option. These courses are being offered as webinar broadcasts. These courses have been very helpful to students who have participated in the past.



Alberta-wide Diploma Prep Review Instructor-led Diploma Prep Review Sessions (live **Alberta-wide** webinar broadcasts) in January and June for English 30-1, Social Studies 30-1, Biology 30, Chemistry 30, Physics 30, Math 30-1, Math 30-2, and Science 30. Lessons are online, in person or there are study note packages available.

Marauder Football

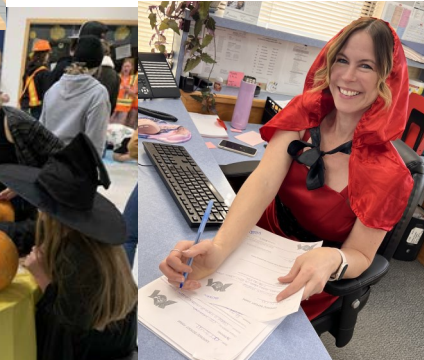
