For <u>Grade 10 students</u>, First Aid courses will be offered in April. For these two days you will be in the **Training Center** learning about first aid. Make sure you check in with your teachers to get homework as regular classes also continue. Upon successful completion of your course, you will receive a high school credit and possess a valid first aid certificate if needed for summer employment. For <u>Grade 9 students</u>, an information meeting will be held on **Parent Teacher Interview night April 11, 2024 at 6:30 pm**. During the meeting, Mrs. Scully will explain the criteria for the Alberta High School Diploma, graduation requirements, course sequencing and course offerings at J. R. Robson.

For Grade 12 students, Student Loan applications are found online starting in early May. Use this link to access the website:

https://studentaid.alberta.ca/. You will required a valid Alberta Digital ID to access the online system. https://account.alberta.ca/ login The Alexander Rutherford applications are also available on this website. In order to receive funding you must apply at least one month prior to your attendance at a post-secondary institution. If you take a year or two off before attending postsecondary school, as long as you qualify, the funds are available to you, so make sure you apply. For information on how to apply, use this website: http://studentaid.alberta.ca/. Students who have created an Apply Alberta login are encouraged to use your PRIVATE email address as your school address will disappear after June 30. The same login, password and email will be used to apply for your Rutherford Scholarship and Student Loan site so use one that is familiar to you, hopefully you will remember the password.

Is my child ready for technology and social media?

It is important to know that there is no right or wrong answer. What works for one family may not work for another. Even within the same family, each child is unique.

Research suggests that it is important as parents to focus on healthy relationships and communication before a child is ready to enter the world of social media and technology.

Some tips to build strong connections with your kids:

- Be available to provide attention and time
- Validate and help manage your child's feelings
- Learn about and get involved in what interests them
- Set limits

There may be benefits to technology when it is used in a healthy way. Such benefits can include:

- Developing interpersonal and communication skills
- Socializing with peers
- Develop skills such as musical, artistic. etc.
- Encourages learning
- Increased understanding of technology advancements, which are inevitable in a young person's future

Using mindfulness to manage tech & social media overload

Notice how using social media makes you or your child feel. Sometimes people compare themselves to others which may create feelings of inadequacy.

Be aware of how much time you and your child spend on social media, what apps they use, interactions that take place, and how you or your child feels afterwards.

Take breaks from social media and technology to do other things like going outside or spending time with family and friends.

Develop healthy digital habits for using technology and social media

- Balance screen time with other family activities
- Discuss online activities with one another
- Have regular conversations about social media
- Create a safe space for your kids to approach you if they have concerns
- Talk about how social media can impact emotions and feelings
- Talk about what is real and what is




