

Attention Grade 12 Students:

- Rutherford Scholarship & other Government Scholarship Applications: Applications are made online. Students are encouraged to apply 1-2 months prior to attending their post -secondary institution. Students can apply sometime in June/July for fall application or one month prior if attending a winter session. 


