This is a 6 week paid internship opportunity for students to work as researchers in STEM labs at the University of Alberta. <u>High School Registration for the 2025-26</u> School Year:

Registration for grade 10 - 11 students takes place in MARCH. Students will receive links to the online registration form in their school email accounts and parents will receive notifications as well on March 13. For Grade 10 & 11 students you will need to complete the registration form (google form) with input from your parents and your counsellor. Grade 9 & 11 students should consult Mrs. Hart and Grade 10 students should consult Mrs. Scully, if you have any questions about registration. All online registration forms for Grade 10 and 11 students will be due on Thursday, March 27. If as parents you have questions or want to discuss changes to your child's registration, please contact the school to schedule an appointment with your child's counselor or arrange an interview on Thursday, March 27.

For <u>Grade 9 students</u>, an information meeting will be held on **Parent Teacher Interview night, Wednesday, April 9, 2025 at 6:30 pm**. During the meeting, Mrs. Hart will explain the criteria for the Alberta High School Diploma, graduation requirements, course sequencing and course offerings at J. R. Robson. Watch for more details on this date in next month's newsletter.

Parent teacher interviews will take place on Thursday, March 27, 2025 from 4:30 - 7:30 and again on Wednesday, April 09, 2025 from 4:30 - 6:30. Parents will have the choice of inperson or phone call interviews. We will be hosting a **registration evening for grade 9 students and parents at 6:30 on April 9** to finalize the registration process for grade 10. 

SUMMER STUDENT POSITIONS

The Vermilion Mental Health Capacity Building Program is seeking summer students to work with VIBE to provide mental health prevention and promotion programming to youth and their families.


One student will work April 28th to August 22, 2025. The second student will work June 16 to August 22nd 2025. These positions are based in Vermilion but include driving out of town. Mileage compensation is provided. Computer skills are an asset.

VIBE is looking for post-secondary students in a human service field that have completed or are returning to school in the fall or starting post-secondary school in the fall. All applicants must be 18 yrs of age at time of start date. Applicants must provide a clear RCMP Criminal Record with a Vulnerable Sector Check and a Child Intervention Check at time of interview. A drivers license and a reliable vehicle is essential. The hourly wage will be \$17.00/hr. plus holiday pay 32 hours a week four days a week. Evening work on Wednesdays and one weekend will be required. Only individuals who are given interviews will be notified. Closing date for applications is March 15th, 2025.
