Principal's Corner

On April 28 we had our last School Council meeting of the school year. At the meeting, I provided information about our school budget and potential plans for the next school year. For a second year in a row, we have been significantly impacted negatively financially. Last year we were forced to reduce the teaching staff by 1.5 teaching positions for this school year. Possible implications for next year include: further staff reduction, introduction of school fees for certain courses, expansion of DL program delivery in high school and priority programming in junior high.




Career Fair



DID YOU KNOW?



Strengthening your brain involves understanding your emotions, thoughts, and actions. It also means learning skills and ways to help you with difficult times. When you do things that stimulate your brain, it releases feel-good chemicals.

Take a moment to turn up the music and dance, share a good laugh, read a book or get creative!

Fueling your body with a variety of food and water provides the energy your body needs to grow, learn and play. A balanced diet can improve your mood, focus and emotional well-being. Sharing meals with others can strengthen connections as well.

Choose foods that make you feel your best, and aim for a balanced diet with plenty of vegetables, fruits, protein, and whole grains.

Moving your body every day improves your mental and physical well-being. Regular movement can lift your mood, energy, and self-esteem. It also helps reduce stress, anxiety and depression.
